Photo ID Requirements

You will be asked to present proof of identification before voting.

This ID must:

- (1) Show your photograph
- (2) Include your name, which must conform to your name on your voter registration record
- (3) Have an expiration date after November 2, 2004; and
- (4) Be issued by the U.S. Government or the State of Indiana.

PLEASE NOTE:

You may obtain a free photo ID from the BMV if you do not have an Indiana driver's license. Mailed absentee ballots do not require a photo ID.
